Over 2.6 million people in Malawi, Mozambique and Zimbabwe are in desperate need of humanitarian aid due to flooding from Cyclone Idai. Cyclone Idai made landfall in southern Africa on March 14, with high winds and rains leaving a trail of devastation. The official death toll continues to rise. Severely damaged crops and infrastructure, and limited access to electricity and water supplies have left survivors in need of basic necessities. Water sources have been contaminated and the risk of cholera and other diseases is high. Emergency food, water and shelter are required to meet immediate needs. PWS&D is responding to meet immediate needs and bring relief to those suffering in the wake of the cyclone. Your gift will be used to provide urgently needed, life-saving assistance. **Please give today!** PWS&D is raising funds as part of the Humanitarian Coalition Cyclone Idai appeal, in collaboration with Canadian Foodgrains Bank (a member of the Humanitarian Coalition). The Government of Canada has launched the ‘Cyclone Idai Matching Fund’. For every eligible dollar donated by individuals to the Humanitarian Coalition and its members between March 15 and April 14, 2019, the Government of Canada will provide the equivalent to the Humanitarian Coalition, up to \$2 million. Through PWS&D’s membership in Canadian Foodgrains Bank, donations to PWS&D’s Cyclone Idai response are eligible to be matched. Please mark your donation in your church envelope as “Cyclone Idai.”

Mission Moment - World Health Day (April 7): Good health starts with good nutrition—especially for young children. In a poor village in Haiti, one-year-old Marcellus was losing weight rapidly and had a persistent cough. Because of crop losses, his single mother was struggling to feed the little boy and his five siblings. She knew Marcellus needed medical attention, but the price of transport to the closest health facility was more than she could afford. Hope came to Marcellus’s mother in the form of a mobile clinic supported by Presbyterian World Service & Development and other Canadian Foodgrains Bank members. There, Marcellus received a nutrient-rich food supplement called Nourimanba, antibiotics and multivitamins. Marcellus is no longer malnourished and is on course to grow up healthy and strong.
