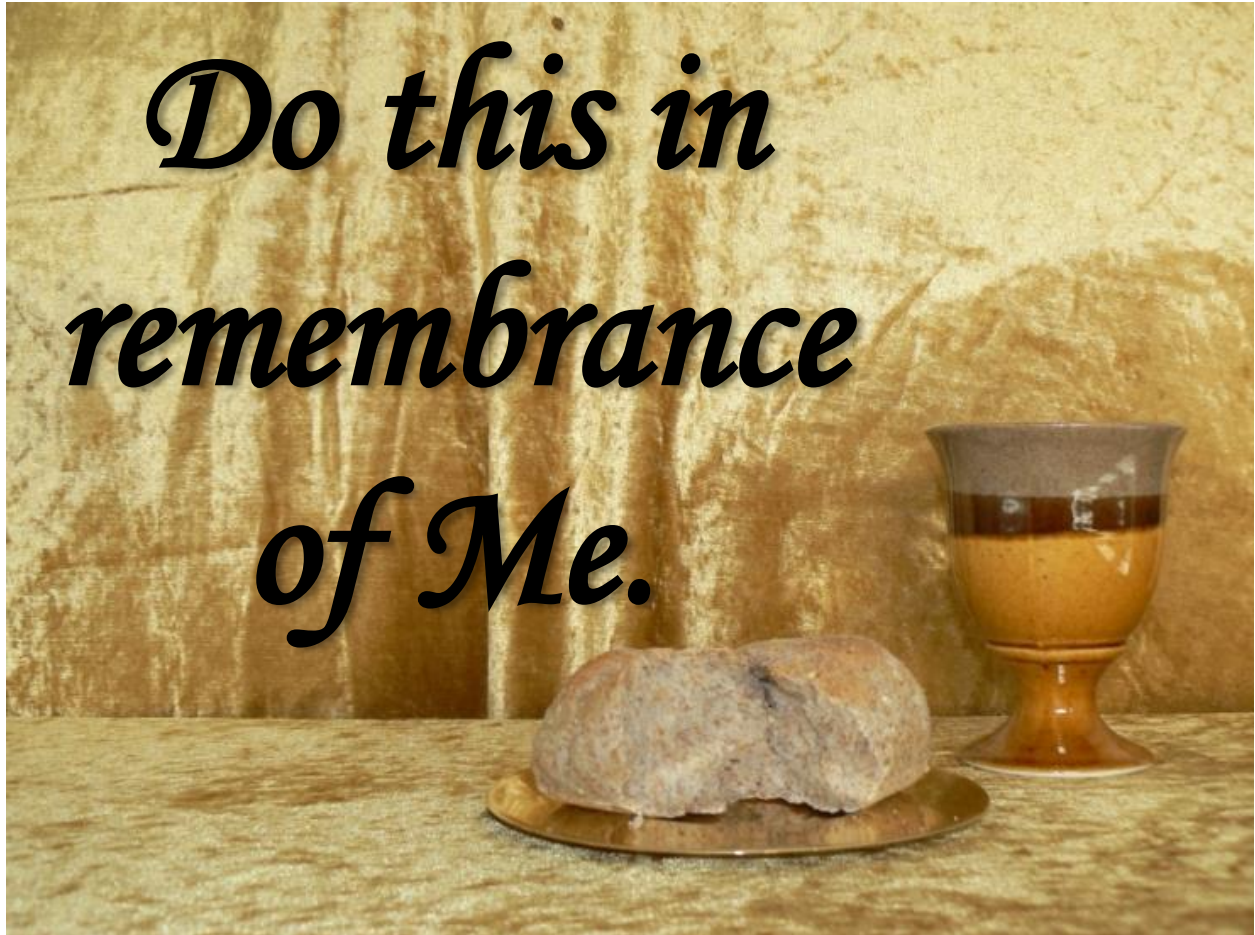

Help for Our Christian Brothers and Sisters in Cuba - On February 18, Nosoon Park is planning a trip to Cuba where he will visit (again) with an evangelical, gospel church in Moron, Cuba. This church has struggled recently with the very basic elements of running its services, and Nosoon has taken up the challenge of bringing their plight to our attention, with the hope that we can help them. Earlier, we heard that Nosoon hoped to raise some money from our congregation to assist this church in a one-time effort to help them build a second washroom in their building. The generous contributions from Calvin in the last two weeks has raised an astounding **\$2,300** for this work (with \$1,260 last week alone), for which we are all grateful to our wonderful congregation. We will keep the collection open until the time of Nosoon's departure on Feb. 18. If you missed the chance so far to contribute to this heroic effort and would still like to, you will have a chance to do so for the two Sundays. There will be a blue collection bucket at the back of the sanctuary where any gift for the Cuban church can be dropped (cheques can be made out to Nosoon Park). Please note that for this current initiative, no tax receipts are

possible as we are donating unofficially to an organization the Canadian government has not recognized as a charity. Mission and Stewardship will be examining ways that Calvin may be able to support our Cuban brothers and sisters in this church more formally in the weeks ahead.
