

Join us for **Lunch Encounter** on Tuesdays at Noon until Nov. 20. The topic of the series is 'Christianity in the 1st and 21st Centuries'. We will learn: how Christianity developed in Rome; about the colosseum, catacombs, the Via Appia (the road where Peter met Jesus); and why Rome and the Vatican became the centre of the Roman Catholic Church. We'll also learn about one of the most famous cathedrals of our time (The Holy Family) that has been under construction for over 100 years in Barcelona, Spain.
